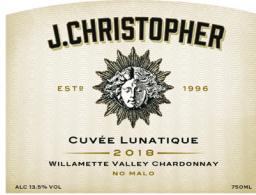

Highlights from the Press – J. Christopher 2018



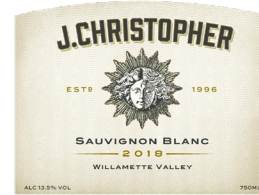
J. Christopher Chardonnay, Cuvée Lunatique, Willamette Valley 2018

[91] *Wine Enthusiast*

Made in a straightforward, unoaked style, this delivers fresh fruit and a hint of butter, though the front label reads “no malo.” It’s a fine, all-purpose white wine that should work well with a variety of seafood and poultry dishes. *April 2020*

[89] *Wine Spectator*

Plush and creamy, with lively acidity, offering floral lemon and tropical fruit flavors, laced with spice notes. Drink now through 2021. *May 2020*



J. Christopher Sauvignon Blanc, Willamette Valley 2018

[90] *Wine Enthusiast*

The winery makes a pair of Sauv Blancs, this one done in an herbal, Loire Valley style, crisply defined with a green edge and gooseberry fruit. There’s good concentration and penetration, with lemon rind flavors extending into the finish. *April 2020*

[90] *Wine Spectator*

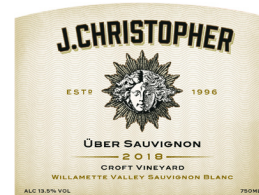
Vibrant and expressive, with floral apricot and peach flavors that finish with a snappy note. Drink now. *May 2020*



J. Christopher Chardonnay, Olenik Vineyard, Chehalem Mountains 2018

[91] *Wine Enthusiast*

Fresh and juicy in the mouth, the flavors conjure up Juicy Fruit gum and a hint of mint. Apples, peaches, pears and butter commingle, and there’s an appealing lushness to the palate. Drink now through the early 2020s. *April 2020*



J. Christopher Über-Sauvignon Croft Vineyard, Sauvignon Blanc, Willamette Valley 2018

[91] *Wine Enthusiast*

This blends wines fermented in a large acacia barrel and a concrete egg. It’s spicy and creamy at the same time, with rather unusual flavors of butter, egg and peavine, along with fresh cut apples. Somehow it all works in a seamless fashion, with good length and a lingering snap to the finish. *April 2020*
